**Upper Newport Bay** in Newport Beach is an estuary – a place where fresh and salt water meet and mix. It is one of only a few remaining estuaries in Southern California and is home to nearly 200 species of birds, including several endangered species. There are also mammals, fish and native plants. **The Bolsa Chica Conservancy** is a non-profit, non-political organization established to ensure the preservation, restoration and enhancement of the Bolsa Chica Wetlands.
