A CHRISTMAS PARTY FOR HOMELESS ORANGE COUNTY CHILDREN

Friday, December 10th in Santa's Village at South Coast Plaza

Costa Mesa, Calif. - 350 homeless children and motel kids will experience a little holiday cheer at "Gifts of Love," a Christmas party being organized just for them. The Festival of Children Foundation, The Happiness Project, YPO Southern California Chapter, and South Coast Plaza are all collaborating on the special night, to be held Friday, December 10, 2010 at 9:00 p.m. in Santa's Village at South Coast Plaza.

The children, ages 3-18, will be brought to the shopping center on buses from different locations throughout Orange County. As each child departs the bus they'll be matched with a volunteer who will spend the entire night with them, helping them navigate the various activities. The children will visit with Santa, ride the reindeer carousel, make arts and crafts, and enjoy food generously provided by Wahoo's Fish Taco and ZPizza. A teen lounge equipped with video games and music will be available for older kids. Every child in attendance will receive a special gift bag targeted for their age group and gender. Over 200 volunteers will be on hand to ensure that the 4th Annual "Gifts of Love" event is a success.

The Happiness Project, which assists underprivileged children with basic needs such as clothing and school supplies throughout the year, has been involved with the holiday party for three years now. "Gifts of Love is a holiday party for children in need in our community. For most children, if it weren't for this party, they would not have a Christmas celebration at all. Each child receives a bag filled with presents including toys, clothing, shoes, toiletries and school supplies. Many children wait to open their bag of presents on Christmas morning, so they have presents to open. These children are incredibly grateful for this experience and we are happy to give it to them," said Lindsay Dickhout, Executive Director of The Happiness Project.
